Fay assured me that I would not be intruding their meeting and that they would love to have me visit. On July 6th, I attended the Ann Arbor Jaycees monthly meeting at a live stage play, held at a park, called Peter and the Starcatcher. Fay showed so much excitement in meeting me and welcomed me as if I was one of her members.



Everybody did. Mike, Erika, both Emilys, Sam and so many others, treated me like family.

Mike shared with me some of the great things they have done in the past like the 4th of July Parade, the Spring Eggstravaganza, and the Summer Carnival. They even invited me to the Superhero Costume Party. They gave me so many ideas to share with my North Columbus Jaycees when I return.

I was disappointed that I was in Michigan during the All Ohio Conference and could not attend. I later found out that Fay was a previous President and current Senator, and she put a good word in for me. I was totally in shock that one little visit from little old me, the visitor from out of state, was worthy to be mentioned by a Senator at a conference. This proves that the Jaycees are not an isolated group of local people, but a collective family worldwide, working together for the greater good.
